How to find out if your home/apartment was a meth lab
www.dec.state.ak.us/spar (click on “Meth labs – list of properties) If you buy or rent an apartment which was documented by law enforcement to have been a meth lab, it will be placed on this list. I’m not certain about hotels, unfortunately, and I don’t know how up-to-date the list is kept. Don’t forget that for every lab that is discovered, there are on average, 10 others in the area that have not been ‘outed’.
