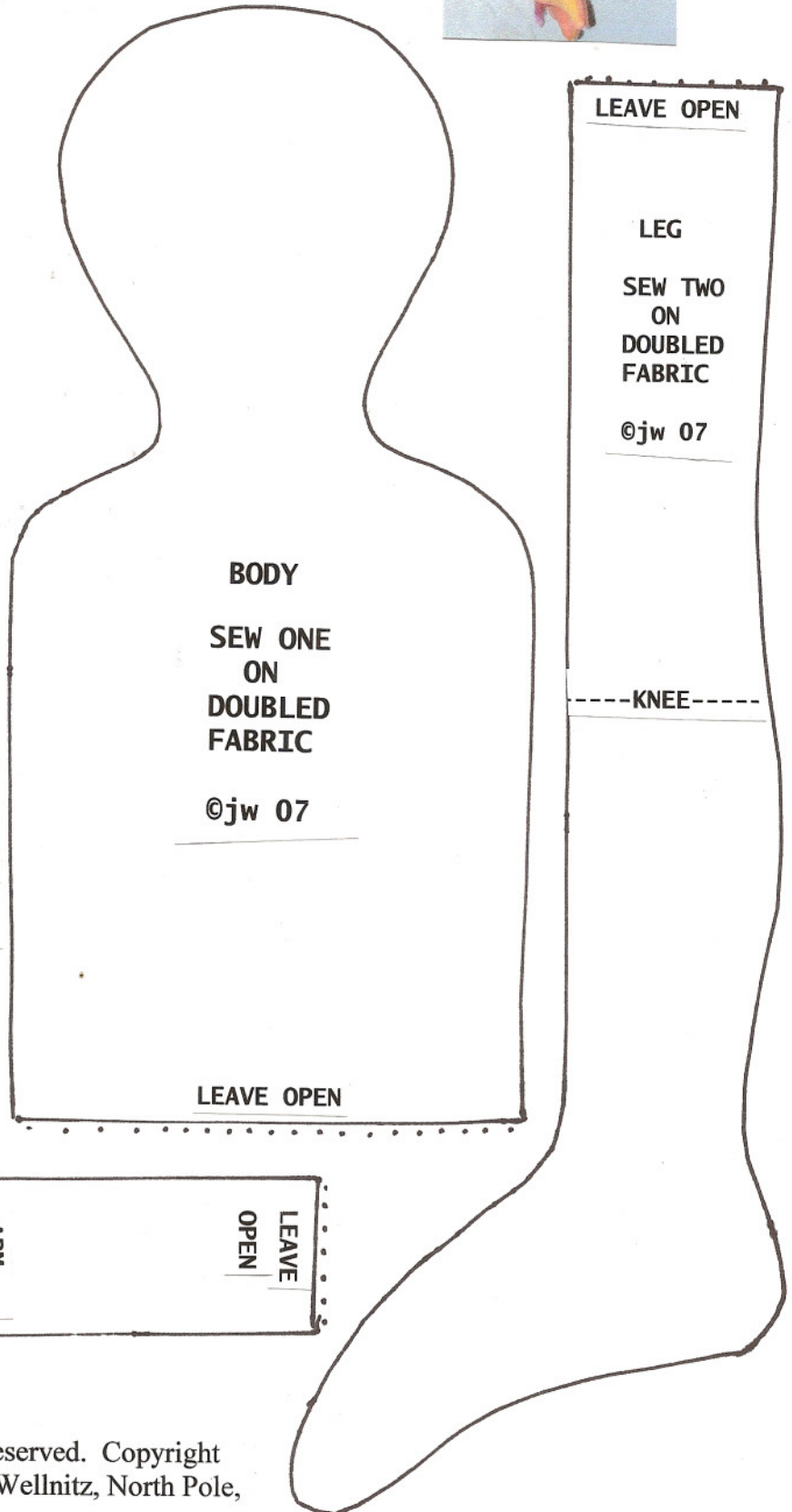
Instructions:

All pattern pieces are templates. Body and arms use flesh colored fabric, legs can use two different color/print fabrics. Sew around templates on doubled fabric (RST) with 1.5mm stitch length and then cut out with 1/4" seam allowance. Clip curves and turn inside out.

Assembly: Stuff leg to knee. Sew a line of stitching across knee. Continue to stuff up to 3/4" of top of leg. Stuff body to within 1/2" of bottom of body. Turn raw edges under and insert top of legs. Pin. Hand-sew closed using a running stitch. Stuff arms until 1/2" from top and close with a gathering stitch, poking raw edges in as you tighten. Sew arms to body using your favorite jointing method.

Finishing: You can paint shoes on. Tie funky fibers on the ankles, wrap the arms and body in fibers. Give 'her' a face and hair. Head fits Barbara Willis' Seaside Sadie face stamp (used on sample).

You may make as many of these as you like; for yourself, as gifts, or to sell. Just be sure to credit Judi Wellnitz as the designer.



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
