

MAT VALLEY KITTIES NO HEALTH GUARANTEE POLICY

A veterinarian has not seen the cats from Mat Valley Kitties unless it has been noted in your vaccination record. We give the kitties first vaccinations and wormer while in our care. We cannot guarantee that your kitten/cat will be 100% healthy when adopted. We recommend that you take your kitten/cat to a veterinarian within 7 days of adopting from Mat Valley Kitties to ensure their good health. You should request the following:

1. Routine exam
2. Worm/Parasite screening from a stool sample
3. Check for ear mites
4. Make future appointment for spay/neuter

It is your sole responsibility as the adopter to provide medical care for your kitten/cat. Mat Valley Kitties is not liable for vet care costs after the kitten leaves the foster home. But, if your kitten gets sick, we would like to know about it A.S.A.P. If you notice any of the following, make an appointment with your veterinarian quickly.

1. Sneezing/coughing
2. Discharge from nose/eyes
3. Stuffy nose or mouth breathing
4. Loose or runny stools/straining to defecate
5. Not eating or drinking every few hours

Kittens should be very active. We will advise you if you have adopted a shy one.
